
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### **Background**

Oral nutritional supplements are part of the compulsory insurance

Oral nutritional supplements are no longer reimbursed



**REJECTION** 



### **Reasons for rejection**

- Fear of misuse as a lifestyle drink
- Lack of evidence for the effectiveness of oral nutritional supplements



Reimbursement only if the patients is hospitalised or possesses an extensive supplementary insurance

Therapy ↓	Insurers obligation	Condition for reimbrusement
Enteral nutrition at home	Yes	If sip feeding at home is not able to meet sufficient nutrition.
Sip feeding at home, oral nutritional supplements	No	
Parenteral nutrition at home	Yes

### **Malnutrition in swiss hospital**

Consequences of malnutrition in the hospital setting:

Increase of time of hospitalisation: 4.9 days

Additional cost per patient: 2790 Euro



Total additional costs due to malnutrition:
 EUR 440 Mio

Establish prevalence of malnutrition in Swiss hospitals and conduct an epidemiological survey of home artificial nutrition in Switzerland

With representatives of industry, home care service, health insurances and health system

Economical development with or without reimbursement of ONS at home were calculated

Scientific evidence of ONS was summarized

Prove that reimbursement of ONS at home in Switzerland are effective, appropriate and cost-effective

Intervention	n	%
Regular diet	2018	56
Dietary fortification	295	8
Oral nutritional supplements	1025	29
Dietary fortification and oral nutritional supplements	238	7
Total	3576	100



- All cases of HAN from 2005 to 2009
- Total of 12'917 cases
- 52 % males / 48 % females
- Mean age: 65.0 years



### Multidisciplinare project meeting: Activities



- To represent the current situation in regard to home artificial nutritional therapies
- To estimate future developments of home artificial nutrition with or without the requested regulatory change
- To find a solution how misuse of ONS can be avoided and how the expansion of the range of ONS products can be prevented



### Literature review and economic analysis





#### Results of the economical calculation & the literature review

#### **Effectiveness**

- increases dietary intake
- reduces mortality and complication in elderly, hospitalised and acutely-ill patients
- associated with functional benefits

#### **Appropriateness**

- no trials showed significant adverse effects
- possibly minor gastrointestinal symptoms
- safe intervention

#### **Cost-effectiveness**

- costs arising are covered withing five years by reducing enteral tube feeding therapies
- in the long term
  additional cost savings
  are expected by
  reducing malnutrition







### **Translation into clinical practice**





### Key achievements (2011 vs 2013)

### Comparison before and after reimbursement of ONS:

- Total artificial nutrition therapies increased: + 83.7%
- Therapies of sip feeding increased: + 146 %
- Therapies of tube feeding decreased: 7 %
- Total costs for artificial nutrition therapies decreased: 9.8 %

Misuse could be prevented



### **Expected benefits**

 Cost savings by replacing expensive tube feeding at home



Elimination of the unfair cost burden



Reduction of hospital costs



Reduction of indirect costs caused by malnutrition
