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	priority setting and activities	<p>ESPEN-ONCA-MNI Joint Session successfully took place, in plenary session at the ESPEN Congress on 3 September. In addition to the presentation of the 2018 Grant winner and an update on the best practice sharing via the ONCA website, Nicola Bedlington – European Patient Forum Secretary General- announced the cooperation between EPF, ENHA and ESPEN on the development of layperson version of ESPEN guidelines.</p> <p>ESPEN guidelines:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The consensus meeting for the Home Enteral Nutrition guideline took place during the ESPEN congress. • The consensus meeting on Home Parenteral Nutrition guideline is expected only in 2019. Developed by the Global Leadership Initiative on</p>

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		<p>Malnutrition (GLIM), gathering ESPEN ASPEN, PENSA and other clinical nutrition societies, the scheme is considered a great advancement to encourage diagnosis, and subsequently nutritional therapy. https://www.ncbi.nlm.nih.gov/pubmed/30181091</p> <p>MNI materials disseminated: The Medical Nutrition Dossier summary booklet and the booklet of the MNI 10th anniversary of the MNI Grant were distributed to ESPEN Congress via the delegate packs. MNI received positive feed-back on the latter.</p> <p>New ESPEN Chair: André van Gossum stepped down from the ESPEN Executive Board, and Rocco Barazzoni was appointed as ESPEN Chair for the next 4 years. MNI Executive Committee met him for an informal exchange of views on 2 September, and the MNI ESPEN WG had a first liaison group meeting on 25 September. R.
