Relationship with ESPEN	MNI ESPEN WG s	ESPEN guidelines – MNI contribution MNI ESPEN WG is currently reviewing the draft guidelines for hospital nutrition and nephrology. MNI secretariat will submit the compiled comments in March. MNI will be represented by Pilar Garcia Lorda or Meike Engfer at the ESPEN guidelines consensus meeting on 29 April in Frankfurt (if physical meeting maintained). ESPEN guideline app project 6 gastroenterologists have tested the IBD guideline app. The feedback is overall positive: the app helps to have easy access to guideline & navigation is easy. However a number of areas of improvements have been identified, including the text of the guideline itself, the readability of the app & the search tool. MNI will share the findings with ESPEN Stephan Bischoff on 9 March and will confirm need to address areas of improvements meaningfully and to meet KPIs after app launch, in order to secure MNI funding. ESPEN congress points attribution system abandoned. MNI sent a letter thanking ESPEN and MCI for their decision. NEMS (Nutrition Education for Medical Students) Financial support of 15K€ confirmed to Cristina Cuerda and Maurizio Muscaritoli. MNI to re-assess if additional budget can be liberated to support the NEMS project in 2 nd half of 2020, based on underspending of other projects. Next steps: ESPEN to confirm 2020 action plan

GROW4: Deadline for GROW submissions on 30 March. NIGs involvement in MNI cancer advocacy programme: The NIGs in Portugal, Poland, Denmark and The Netherlands have confirmed they have submitted a response to the EU consultation on the cancer roadmap. Next steps: March/April: MNI plans to run a webinar to explain to NIGs how they can contribute to the EU cancer Plan. The CoC had a call with Clifford Chance with respect to competition law aspects of interactions with medical societies. Clifford Chance advised to take a cautious approach in relation to measures that could have an impact on the individual marketing activities by MNI members, although there are doubts as to whether such measures would have an appreciable effect on the market. The CoC WG is reviewing comments submitted by the European Patients Forum. Next steps: Legal review of final draft by Clifford Chance, before publication MNI companies to plan for the implementation of the code. CoC WG to be discontinued once the code is published.

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		 Press release (joined with SNE) welcoming the EU Commission's initiative 'Beating Cancer Plan' Cancer infographic published and disseminated on World Cancer Day (4 February) and handed over in person by Léa Coulet to EU Commissioner for health – Stella Kyriakides. MNI delegation participation in the EU Commission event at the EU Parliament on 4 Feb. Outreach to members of EU Parliament ongoing: meetings with 5 MEPs so far, more meetings confirmed in March/April/May (depending on access to EP due to coronavirus epidemic measures). Meeting with European Commission - DG Santé unit responsible for the cancer strategy on 25 February: nutritional care is not a priority, but can be distilled horizontally through QoL, training of HCPs, etc. Recommendation to liaise with MoH to create a national push for the topic. Event in European Parliament secured on 7 May - organised by ENHA/EPF Joint MNI/SNE response to the open consultation on 2 March. 4 NIGs contributed: Portugal, Denmark, The Netherlands, and Poland. All key messages on cancer available today are available directly on MNI homepage. Support to EONS education project confirmed up to 23K€. Details still to be finalised. MNI will send a call for topic leader.
