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| | Nutritional Care for All" (ONCA) | ONCA 2020 conference confirmed in Copenhagen The ONCA conference will take place in Denmark - Copenhagen on 16-17 November 2020, co-organised by FMF (industry), DSKE (PEN Society) and Dietitians association. Patient groups, with a focus on cancer patients, will be invited to join. Objectives of the ONCA campaign in Denmark - shared by the three organisations: Raise awareness of politicians (new government & parliament). Improve medical guidelines (developed by the MoH) to include recommendations on screening and delivery of nutritional therapy when patients are diagnosed as malnourished (led by DSKE). The NIG (FMF) is fully supportive and has invited MNI to join the conference advisory group. |

| National Industry groups / GROW project | Grow the medical nutrition market in Europe | GROW 3 was awarded to Brazil and Slovakia on 2 September in Krakow. GROW 4 criteria announced in July and presented at MNI-NIGs annual meeting on 2 September. RFP and ppt presentation available on MNI Intranet. MNI-NIGs annual meeting (ESPEN congress Krakow 2 Sept) The meeting took place successfully with over 100 participants, excellent presentations, good interactions between national industry colleagues. All presentations, posters, are available on MNI Intranet. Meeting summary was sent to MNI members and NIGs on 17 September. Polish NIG MNI Executive Committee and General Managers of Poland for Baxter, Fresenius Kabi, Nutricia and Nestlé met on 2 September and agreed to cooperate on a joint agenda for EN /PN.
