ONCA	Promote screening and nutritional care strategies at the national level under the banner "Optimal Nutritional Care for All" (ONCA)	Austria joins ONCA, bringing the campaign to 18 countries. This is good news as Austria takes over the rotating presidency of the EU for the period July-December 2018. Frank de Man is in touch with the Austrian Ministry of Health to connect ONCA to the Austrian EU presidency agenda. To be followed.  NIGs involvement: A joint ENHA-MNI webinar is planned on 12 June to present the ONCA 2018 action plan and encourage NIGS to get more involved. The objective is also to encourage the NIGs to support ONCA communication strategy by submitting good practices and sharing ONCA good practices. 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with patient groups	voice on nutrition	European umbrella group for national coalitions of patients and specific chronic disease groups - has published the position statement on information to patients on food and nutrition.  The paper is a good summary of the links between food, nutrition and health and articulates – among others- three recommendations of relevance to the MNI:  1. call for lay person summaries of recognised guidelines, developed by patient organisations, with the support of health professionals  2. call for better access to appropriate nutrition and reimbursement  3. call for screening for DRM and for efforts in the training and awareness of health professionals
		<b>Development of educational materials:</b> MNI shared some materials (branded and non branded) with the EPF as inspiration for its Task Force on nutrition who is currently developing educational materials addressed to patients.
		<b>EPF-MNI work agreement signed</b> : The Work Agreement was signed by both parties and the payment of the 20,000€ processed (unrestricted grant).

Global FSMP	<ul> <li>Raise awareness about malnutrition and value of medical nutrition beyond Europe</li> <li>Link in with local medical nutrition decision-makers and key stakeholders</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Health economics study: The Brazilian WG – coordinated by GENE- is conducting an analysis of the "Acerto Project" database to assess the impact of oral enteral nutritional therapy. They plan to collect new data in the patient records, with the support from Cuiaba's Hospital, to improve the database and consequently the analysis. The objective is to discuss the study with the Ministry of Health to support a change in current protocols and encourage the Brazilian government to pay for oral nutritional therapy.</li> <li>"Forum of discussion to combat hospital malnutrition": GENE and BRASPEN (The Brazilian Society for Parenteral and Enteral Nutrition) are partnering to organize the 'forum' in Brasília on June 6th. Health professionals (doctors and nutritionists), Ministry of Health representatives and Congress participants will attend. The discussions will focus on what needs to be done to combat patient malnutrition, from both the public and private healthcare systems perspective. At the end of the event, a document will be developed for use in future meetings with the different stakeholders in Brazil.</li> </ul>
		ASEAN:  • The ASEAN WG decided to focus its limited resources in Indonesia. Joint action in



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		Thailand did not reach consensus among all companies and was discarded for now. The ASEAN WG met with <a href="GAPMMI">GAPMMI</a> (Indonesian Food and Beverage Association) in April to offer help and expertise on FSMP regulatory discussions. GAPMMI welcomed the support, and offered a MoU focusing on local awareness for FSMPs. GAPMMI also offered to introduce the MNI WG to the Indonesian Ministry of Health expert group.

It gathered 86 participants from 25 countries (most EU countries and Turkey, the USA, Australia, New Zealand, Singapore, South Africa, Malaysia, Russia).</li> <li>Training: The HEOR WG is actively preparing the training addressed to NIGs taking place on 25 June in Frankfurt, entitled 'Demonstrating the value of medical nutrition to decision makers and influencers'. The training will focus on equipping the NIGs with the tools to engage with decision makers/influencers rather than providing a technical training on HE methodology and modeling.</li> <li>The training also aims to build a network of health economics experts.</li> <li>NIGs secretariats were invited to nominate a health economics leader per country, and to identify 1 to 3 experts to join the training. 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		The HEOR WG met on 20 March and agreed it is not necessary to update the Medical Nutrition Dossier in the close future.  However the following questions were considered for future action:  • Updating the data on the cost of malnutrition €170 billion which dates from 2009  • Developing more accurate data on the cost of treating malnutrition vs the cost of treating obesity  Next steps:  • 25 June: MNI training addressed to NIGs and MNI companies  • 3 September: present the Medical Nutrition Dossier at ESPEN-ENHA-MNI Joint Session and to national industry groups  • 17-18 October: MNI workshop - discussion on future HEOR projects

Many thanks to the team for their great effort.  • The ESPEN WG refined their procedure for contributing to ESPEN Guidelines: in case of non-alignment between MNI companies, MNI will vote 'undecided'.



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		Education project  ESPEN – under Cristina Cuerda leadership – is organising the kick-off meeting on 19 July with ESPEN representatives (André Van Gossum, Cristina Cuerda, Matthias Pirlich, Maurizio Muscaritoli and Zeljko Krznaric) and the deans of 4 universities (Universidad Autónoma de Madrid; Université Libre de Bruxelles; University of Zagreb, Sapienza Univerity in Rome). The meeting has three objectives:  1. understand opportunities/gaps/threats for integration of nutrition into the medical curriculum  2. share best practices (e.g. including Italian experience, NNedPro)  3. draft with the deans a position statement on the integration of nutrition into the medical curriculum – to be published in Clinical Nutrition
