ONCA	Promote screening and nutritional care strategies at the national level under the banner "Optimal Nutritional Care for All" (ONCA)	Successful ONCA conference The conference attracted over 400 participants on day 1, with the participation of two members of European Parliament, two members of the Portuguese Parliament, the mayor of the city hosting the conference (Sintra) and the head of the national competent authority (INFARMED). The conference also attracted national media coverage.  During the industry session, NIGs confirmed that ONCA is a great asset to liaise with decision makers and patient groups, raise awareness, share best practice, and benchmark country policies.

Engagement with patient groups	Leverage patients voice on nutrition	<ul> <li>EPF action plan on nutrition - 2018 deliverables</li> <li>In 2018, with the financial support of MNI, the EPF has established a task force on nutrition, contributed to ONCA and published two documents:         <ul> <li>EPF position on information to patients on nutrition and food</li> <li>EPF position on Clinical Nutrition Guidelines and Summaries for Patients</li> </ul> </li> <li>The latter outlines the need to involve patients in the development of clinical nutrition guidelines and was launched at the ONCA conference.         <ul> <li>(Both documents were shared with the NIGs, as these might be helpful for NIGs engagement with patient groups at country level.)</li> <li>In 2019 the EPF plans to cooperate with ESPEN to develop lay versions of ESPEN guidelines and support the dissemination of guidelines and 2018 documents to patients and EU policy makers (pending MNI financial support).</li> </ul> </li> <li>Next steps:         <ul> <li>MNI Executive Committee to conclude on MNI support to the EPF action plan on nutrition.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	
EU FSMP	<ul> <li>Ensure appropriate implementation of new regulation for FSMPs at national level</li> </ul>	Italy – guidelines on FSMPs The Italian MoH has published revised guidelines in November 2018 stating that the final say on whether a product can be classified as FSMP is a national competence.  Next steps:  • The WG will monitor the situation in Italy.	



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		The EU FSMP WG is maintained in 2019 in order to monitor developments at national level and react if necessary. No budget requested.	
Global FSMP	<ul> <li>Raise awareness about malnutrition and value of medical nutrition beyond Europe</li> <li>Link in with local medical nutrition decision-makers and key stakeholders</li> </ul>	ASEAN: Following the MNI Executive Decision on 23 November, the MNI ASEAN WG and the MNI project in Indonesia have been discontinued.  Next steps: MNI companies to organise industry cooperation in Indonesia independently from the MNI.  China: An MNI delegation provided MNI views on FSMPs to SAMR officials (Chinese State Administration of Market Regulation) during a training organised by the United Nations Industrial Development Organisation in Vienna on 14 December. The following topics were covered: EU regulatory framework, need for clinical studies and good manufacturing principles. Some questions indicate that the FSMP category is not fully understood by Chinese regulators.  Next steps: Global FSMP WG to advise if a follow up is needed.  India: No update received.  Brazil: The Brazilian team is progressing with the health economic study intiated in Q3 2018. The study will support discussions on reimbursement with the authorities, supported scientifically by BRASPEN (the Brazilian Society of Enteral and Parenteral Nutrition).	



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		BRASPEN is currently developing 3 scientific articles showing the importance of ONS to manage related to malnutrition:  Oral supplement vs. standard nutritional therapy  Nutritional therapy vs. Pattern Impact of hospital malnutrition  Next Steps:  Economic model and budget impact for the public health system will be finalized by the end of January/19 and the dossier submission to the MoH will be ready early February/19  GENE will organise information from the health economics study and prepare a PR strategy to start the discussion on nutritional therapy and reimbursement with the new Ministry of Health team as soon as all material was finalized (dossier and position paper).  The new Government will start in January 2019.
